OFFICERS FOR THE 2016-2017 COLUMBIAN YEAR

Financial Secretary Emanuel Ponte informed me that certain officers are appointed and others are elected. The appointed officers are the Financial Secretary, the

Chaplain, and the Lecturer. The Financial Secretary is appointed by the Supreme Knight, upon the recommendation of the Council. The Trustees are Past Grand Knights, who serve as trustees for three years after their tenure as Grand Knight. Only the 1st—year Trustee is elected. The 2nd— and 3rd— year Trustees are the previous 1st— and 2nd— year Trustees that move in succession to completing their three—year terms. The Chaplain and Lecturer are appointed by the Grand Knight.

STATE CONVENTION 2016

Grand Knight Tom Stein and District Warden Bill Nahorn III joined 589 other delegates in attending the State Convention at the Santa Clara Marriott from May 19 through May 21. One-hundred and forty resolutions were voted on, and a new State Warden was elected. The State Warden was elected by such a large majority that there was no need for a second ballot. On the recreational side, there was a golf tournament and a ladies luncheon.

State Chaplain Rev. John Cantwell stated that Christ died because He loved us, and His love for us is shown in the Crucifixion. Consequently, Rev. Cantwell advocated removing the Risen Jesus, like the one at Presentation, from the Cross, and replacing it with the crucified Christ. He encouraged the Grand Knights to convince their pastor(s) to replace the Risen Jesus with the crucified Christ.

This will be the last State Convention in the San José area. Due to the high demand for hotel rooms in the San Francisco Bay Area, the Northern California Delegation was unable to obtain lodgings in the range of \$150 – \$160 per day. The Delegation was successful in finding accommodations in Sacramento for \$99.00 per day including parking! Subsequently, the next three State Conventions to be held in Northern California will be located in Sacramento.

Just a little bit about a bike ride. I am taking on the Mission 360 for my 8th time this year. As you all know this ride consists of 360 miles down the California coast from Watsonville to Malibu. We ride 60 miles a day for 6 days, and end up in the parking lot of Malibu Catholic Church. We pay our own expenses along the way, such as lodging, meals, and bike repairs.

But let me just say it's not only about the bike tour. This is a charity ride for people around the world. This year we are raising money for water wells in small villages in Nicaragua. So far we have installed 4 wells and our goal is 12. Each well costs \$5,500, so you do the math. 
