PENTECOST IS EVERY DAY

The Feast of Pentecost marks the end of the Easter season, approximately 50 days after the Resurrection of Jesus. This is the day

that the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem.

Tongues of fire came down upon the disciples enabling them to speak and to speak in the passion of burning love in their native languages. This is the fulfillment of the promise of Jesus who had said that He would send an Advocate, the Holy Spirit to help them to fulfill His mission, the mission of the Church.

We are also called to continue the mission through holiness, through bearing witness to Christ, and through our sacramental life. The Holy Spirit has come to all of us through the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Confirmation, and Reconciliation. 
The scholarships are sent to St. Mary's in the name of the winners for their tuition.
