The Easter Season

Easter Sunday is now a day of the past. Is Easter over? For the secular world, this may be true but for us Catholics and other Christians, it is merely the beginning of the

Easter season. It is 50 days of celebration that ends with Solemnity of Pentecost. The word "pentecost" refers to the 50th day.

The Jews celebrate a Pentecost called Shavuot but for us, we focus on the life of Jesus. After His Resurrection, Jesus remained on earth for 40 days teaching the Apostles. Then He ascended into heaven. Out of fear, the Apostles went into hiding in the Upper Room and did not go out to preach and baptize. It was not until the 10th day after the Ascension when the Holy Spirit descended upon them that they were inspired to carry out the Lord's commands. Forty days of Jesus on earth and 10 days after the Ascension is 50 days after the Resurrection that brought about Pentecost.

So during the Easter season, let us reflect on Jesus' teachings in the Scriptures and see what He is asking us to do. May we be challenged to be better than how we were yesterday. May we be renewed in the spirit and be inspired to spread his Word. Come Holy Spirit,




