The Easter Season

Easter Sunday is now a day of the past. Is Easter over? For the secular world, this may be true but for us Catholics and other Christians, it is merely the beginning of the

Easter season. It is 50 days of celebration that ends with Solemnity of Pentecost. The word "pentecost" refers to the 50th day.

The Jews celebrate a Pentecost called Shavuot but for us, we focus on the life of Jesus. After His Resurrection, Jesus remained on earth for 40 days teaching the Apostles. Then He ascended into heaven. Out of fear, the Apostles went into hiding in the Upper Room and did not go out to preach and baptize. It was not until the 10th day after the Ascension when the Holy Spirit descended upon them that they were inspired to carry out the Lord's commands. 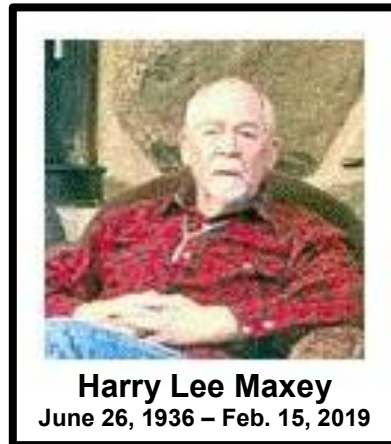

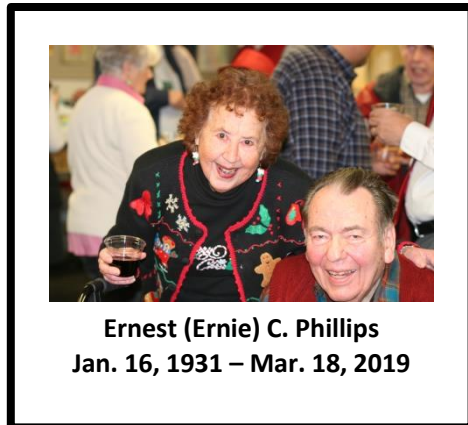
