SPIRITUAL ADVISER'S COLUMN

Dark Night of the Soul

Saint Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) is one of my favorite saints. She is a real modern-day saint to me because she was a living person that exists in my lifetime

so far. I have never met her but her stories of holiness and heroics are legends to me and many other people. But even as holy as she was, she experienced a dark night of the soul for the last 50 years of her life. From 1946 until her death in 1997, she did not feel the presence of God but she still continued to radiate his love and mercy to the poor in Calcutta and around the world.

Dr. Dianne Traflet, a professor of pastoral theology at Seton Hall University, talks about Mother Teresa's dark night and what we can learn from her example:

- 1. Let Your "Yes" Mean Yes:
 - Mother Teresa had a call within a call. She knew she was called to be a nun and she said yes to God for that. But she also had a call within a call to go to the slums of Calcutta. That call was very distinctive as she heard God tell her to carry Him into the homes of the poor and be a light for these people.
 - In her darkness and in her pain, she recommitted her "yes" to every aspect of her vocation. When the going got rough, she said yes again in various ways to those different aspects of her vocation. This is very important for us. When the going gets rough, do we begin to say "no" or do we say "yes"?
- Get Close to Christ So You Can Radiate Him: It is interesting that even though she experienced darkness, we never saw that in her.

When we hear or see her, she always had a smile in her voice or on her face. She would say "a hearty yes to God and a big smile for all." Even though she could not see or feel the presence God at times, God was always in her heart. He was a part of who she was and she was reflective of His presence and His love for us. She was close to God. When we hear or looked at her, we were not just seeing Mother Teresa but we were seeing Christ.

3. God Gives Us Tools, Even in the Darkness:

Faith is believing in what we do not see. There are going to be times in our lives when we do have some sort of doubt. Scripture says: "I believe, help my unbelief." This is what we can see in Mother Teresa. In this verse, let the process of recommitment occur. Make a recommitment to vocation, to the yes, and to bring God to others. God will help us do it too. He gives us the Eucharist, the sacraments, good people, good communities of faith, and His Mother who intercedes for us. We see this with Mother Teresa. The spiritual tools of the Eucharist, prayer, rosaries, and the Blessed Sacrament helped her to live out her vocation. These are important tools for us as well.

4. Carry Your Cross with Joy:

Joy is defined as God's presence in life. It radiates in times of happiness and sadness. There are moments in life when we see people who are suffering and we see a smile on their faces. How is that? It is God's presence. It is that they have the peace of knowing and doing God's will. This gives joy and hope. Let us know God's will and let us do it. This is where we find our peace and our joy.



PANCAKE BREAKFAST


