SPIRITUAL ADVISER'S COLUMN

Sports and Spirituality

There are many analogies between sports and spirituality. Spiritual growth and athletic growth share a common thread. Both require discipline, practice, strength,

community.

Pope John Paul II urged every Christian "to become a strong athlete for Christ, that is, a faithful and courageous witness to his Gospel."

What, then, does a Catholic approach to sport have? This does not just benefit Catholics but a wider culture and sport itself.

There are 4 Catholic themes that may answer this question:

- 1. Play is accepted in cultural expressions and taken seriously intellectually.
 - A person should not be working or studying all the time; there is a need for time for recreation, which play and games provide. Play allows time to "refresh" so that the person can be productive in work. It restores and recreates the person as a whole.
- The human being is created in the image and likeness of God.

Sport competitions provide the opportunity for people of different cultures, races, and religions to encounter one another as members of one human family.

The Catholic Youth Organization (CYO), founded by Bishop Bernard J. Sheil, is a good model of this. From the get go, CYO welcomed athletic participation by all and provided a venue for young people of different socioeconomic, racial and religious backgrounds to compete against one another.

This understanding of the human being is also the foundation of Catholic social teaching on the dignity of the human person. It is the focal point when it comes to the consideration of sport practices and policies.

Pope John Paul II says this: "Sport is at the service of the person, and not the person of the sport." Sport serves the person when it leads to integral development.

3. The human body is a unity of body, mind, and spirit. Sports affect people at the level of consciousness, that is, their making of meaning, understanding of themselves and their relationships with others. It will also affect them at the level of the spirit, that part of the person that makes one capable of relationship with the Holy Spirit.

Educational institutions provide opportunities for young people to understand how sports help them to understand themselves, their relationships with others, and the meaning of their lives. The element of joy associated with play is particularly important to their spiritual lives. Pope Francis says: "Play reminds us of joy, the joy of the Lord."

4. The human being is social by nature.

We are meant to be communal and in the context of a community, our gifts are recognized and called forth. Experiences of playing on a team with communal values can help to appreciate the importance of commitment to the common good and to the marginalized. It is the principles of love, respect, compassion, and service to others that sets the community apart from others.

So, my brothers, do all things in love and in joy. For it is in the joy of the Lord that we find peace, comfort, happiness, and love itself. May God continue to bless you in everything.


